

## **NYSILL -- The New York State Library's ILL System**

### **Introduction**

The State Library offers libraries located in New York free interlibrary loan services. We lend books and supply photocopies to New York State libraries free of charge. Libraries can request through their systems or can make their requests directly.

The State Library has a collection of over 20 million items, from medical journals to industry standards to federal documents. Our mission is to serve the educational needs of all the citizens of New York. Interlibrary loan is one way we share our collections with all New Yorkers.

### **Directions for making NYSILL requests using the new interface (August 2010)**

1. Go to [www.nysl.nysed.gov](http://www.nysl.nysed.gov).
2. Choose Catalog.
3. Search for the book or journal you need.
4. Display the full record.
5. Copy the title and author.
6. Choose I need material.
7. Choose Interlibrary loan request.
8. Choose Interlibrary loan (ILL) request (libraries only).

### **Log in**

The first time you use the NYSL ILLiad interface you will need to register your library. You can use your NYSILL ID and password, or you can make up something else.

Bookmark the page <http://nysl.illiad.oclc.org/illiad/lending/lendinglogon.html> so you can track the progress of your requests.

Once you are registered/logged in, go to the request page. On the left side you have a choice -- book or journal.

Paste the title and author that you copied from the catalog.

For books all we need is the title and author, for journal articles we need the citation.

Click on the submit request button at the bottom of the request.
