The **Larry J. Hackman Research Residency Program** supports doctoral candidates, those at the postdoctoral level, and other scholars/researchers with awards for advanced research in New York State history, government, or public policy. The Residency Program is made possible by and administered by the Archives Partnership Trust.

The **Student Research Award** promotes and recognizes excellence in student research. This statewide competition is open to all New York State students in grades 4-12.
